THR Calendar Events

May 15th - Heifer Pregnancy EPD/Spring Exposure Inventory 2008. The inventory was mailed out to all members around the 15th of May and should be returned to the National Office postmarked no later than August 18th. The heifer exposure inventory report is available on the web site under REDS - Redangus.org.

May 29th - Spring Inactivation, Females missing a 2007 record. Females listed as Spring calving cows will be subject to inactivation May 29th, if one of the THR requirements has not been received for 2007. The National Office will be mailing out a list to each member who has females that have been inactivated. If information (calf record or reason code) is submitted to the National Office prior to 7-03-08, the females will be reinstated without charge. If information is received after that time, the female will be subject to the reactivation fees. This

particular report is NOT available on the web site. However, calving records or reason codes may be submitted via RRTS found under REDS. Keep in mind the females have been inactivated and therefore will not appear on the inventory listing. Therefore, use the blank entry at the top of the inventory to submit the record.

June 1st - Fall 2008 Herd Inventories. Inventories will be mailed out by June 6th. The preliminary inventory is based on the previous year's inventory plus disposal and transfer information reported to the National Office by this date.

Fall Herd Inventories are available on-line, via the Red Angus web site under REDS. For details regarding, the Fall Inventory Calendar, please refer to the following two pages. The calendar will provide you with mail out dates and return dates of all reports as well as a brief description of the information required to complete the report.

Reminders

Contact Information. Please notify the National Office in writing, via mail, fax or e-mail to Judy Edwards - judy@redangus.org when any of the following information is new or changed for your account. Address, Phone (home, office, fax, and cell), E-mail.

Corrections. All corrections, whether the work is pending or has been processed must be received in writing (mail, fax, or e-mail). Office policy does not allow us to take information over the phone.

Transfer VS. Disposal Code 15 - sold without transfer. If you have sold an animal, please submit the information for transfer. The transfer process will remove the animal from your inventory. DO NOT submit a disposal code 15 for animals that you intend to submit for transfer, by doing this you could possibly be subject to reactivation fees when the transfer application is received.

We encourage you to utilize the member lookup accessible on the web site, Redangus.org under data searches when completing buyer information for cattle to be transferred. The member lookup will display a member's account number. Whenever possible, please supply us with a new owner's account number to ensure that the animal(s) are transferred correctly. ■

Genetic Defects Reporting

Beginning with the 2007 calf crop, it is now required that the following statement be checked for your data to be processed. Please remember to check the box found at the top of your weaning worksheets or registration form before submitting your data. Data submitted on-line via REDS or Cow Sense/Red Wing, members will be asked to check-mark a statement as follows -
